

CAPC 2022 Highlights: Year in Review

The mission of the Center to Advance Palliative Care (CAPC) is to increase the availability of quality, equitable health care for all people living with a serious illness, and their families. **Thanks to the commitment of our funders, our members, and our outstanding team, in 2022 CAPC led the way in providing the essential strategies, tools, and training necessary to meet this need.**

Through our national Project Equity initiative, we built a new Innovation Hub featuring a selection of the most replicable solutions we found to address health care disparities for Black patients with serious illness.

We enhanced our clinical training offerings to meet several urgent needs. In response to the nationwide opioid crisis, we launched new continuing education courses on safe management of chronic pain. Working with prominent pediatric palliative care experts, we defined the skills that all pediatric clinicians should have to provide best care for medically complex infants, children, and adolescents. Since the launch of our online clinical training curriculum in 2015, 100,000+ clinicians have taken more than 950,000 CAPC courses.

And, to support the work of specialty palliative care teams, we created six new operational toolkits and developed new technical assistance to help palliative care leaders with messaging and marketing their services.

As we enter the new year, CAPC has an ambitious agenda. Our goal is to ensure all patients receive care that is aligned with their preferences and priorities.

This includes systemically addressing the gaps in access to palliative care that still exist for some patients due to geography, care setting, race, or insurance coverage. We will be laser-focused on supporting change agents within the palliative care field with exciting new offerings, and driving national strategies to weave palliative care into the fabric of U.S. health care through initiatives like The John A. Hartford Foundation Tipping Point Challenge.




