Sample Diagnoses Codes to Identify Patients Living with Serious Illness



Identifying people with potentially unmet palliative care needs is often a challenge, as palliative care is needed by a broad range of diagnoses, often those with complex or advanced stages of illness. This document can provide a starting point for a proactive identification process using claims data. Diagnostic inclusion criteria helps to define a population based on need, not prognosis.
